



GU MEDICAL ONCOLOGY

CLINICAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

This is a **two-year, fully-funded,** clinical research fellowship with the Genitourinary Disease Site Team (GU DST) within the Department of Oncology at the Juravinski Cancer Centre and McMaster University. The GU DST is a high-volume, dynamic group with active clinical and translational research expertise. This fellowship would include 1-2 days clinical work and remaining time protected for research. Key exposure opportunities include:

- Participation in investigator-initiated and industry sponsored clinical trials
- Innovative biomarker and translational -omics collaborations with established teams at McMaster University
- Access to large national and international clinical databases for cancer outcomes research in kidney and bladder cancer
- Connections with: Ontario Clinical Oncology group (OCOG), Program in Evidence-based Care (PEBC), and the Escarpment Cancer Research Institute (ECRI)
- Renowned statisticians in research methodology and experts in learning health systems / artificial intelligence research
- Clinical experience across GU cancers, including multi-modality therapies, GU tumour board, and multi-disciplinary clinics

The fellow will be expected to develop and complete at least one independent research project in clinical or translational research. Presentation of this project at a national/international meeting and preparation of a manuscript suitable for submission to a peer-reviewed journal will be required and supported financially. The fellow will be provided with supervision and mentorship in these areas, with graduated levels of independence as appropriate, to ensure successful completion of the goals and objectives.

Invitations for interviews will be given to selected applicants. Incomplete applications will not be

accepted.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must have completed Medical Oncology subspecialty
- 2. CPSO licensing to practice in the Province of Ontario
- **3.** Curriculum vitae include information on teaching and research positions, list of publications, certificates, awards, scholarships, memberships, etc
- 4. *Three appropriate professional letters of reference, one from the Residency Program Director*
- **5.** Covering letter outlining personal learning goals and preliminary thoughts for development of a research/clinical project
- 6. Medical School transcripts
